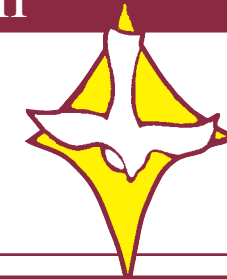
After two years in production, we now have a 30 minute DVD on the Galilean Home entitled *"The Story"*. It is available on request with any donation.

Busy Summer Days Ahead

Spring has finally made its grand entrance in Kentucky. We've recently had temperatures in the middle 80's. This was always Mom's favorite time of year. Why not? Just look around. The summer season is already beginning to look like a busy one. We already have five work teams booked in June and July; from Cincinnati, Ohio, Indianapolis, Indiana, and Pennsylvania. Most groups stay for 5-7 days. A lot of work gets done and also a lot of good fellowship.

School days are coming to a close soon. May 6th is the last day of school this year. We have six kindergarten and 10 high school students graduating. This is the largest number we have ever had. Usually we only have 3 or 4 high school graduates. We had 72 students, which is about what we have every year. The Galilean Christian Academy started in 1987. There has been a lot of water under the bridge since then.

The major renovation of both bathrooms in the Blessing House was completed this winter. All of the ceramic tile used makes it look like they belong in a king's castle. It has made it so much easier to give the children baths, they have so

much more room to work with. We also spent the winter renovating our blue guest cabin. It has needed work for a long time. Now it looks like a brand new cabin.

The Bread of Life Café is humming along. Winter is always slow in the restaurant business, but

pretty spring weather brings people out to eat. We are located on Highway 127 South, a main route to Lake Cumberland which is just 20 miles south of the Café. The Trading Post reports busy days now as well. It serves as a good outlet for the extra clothing and furniture, along with the other odds and ends we get. It keeps six ladies very busy six days a week.

The Angel House is always our most popular stop for visitors. Currently there are nine babies that reside in the Angel House. We have had hundreds of babies come through since we started the Born Free Ministry back in 1991.

The Blessing House remains a busy beehive as usual. We have 18 residents there, along with another 13 living in the main house and girls' dorm.

No... I have not moved into my cabin yet. It is finished with only a little work left to do on the

kitchen cabinets. Maybe this will be the season to make the big move. It is hard to believe that Mom has been gone for nearly four years now.

Tonight, I have a speaking engagement at a church in Lexington. I had another one just two weeks ago. Now, the reason this is such an event to mention is because I have never ventured out to speak in churches before. Mom always had that calling. But, it looks like the baton was passed on to me when she was called Home. So, if you would like for me to present the Galilean Home in your church or gathering, just call us at 1-800-352-2030. I'll close for now and take a moment to thank all of our supporters who make all this activity possible. As Sandy used to say, we in ourselves can do nothing. It takes a lot of team work, not only physically, we need your financial support as well. As most of you know, we do not take state support, but rely on God's people to sustain and lift us up. Without your support, we would have ceased to survive decades ago. It was 1969 when we adopted Jeremy and started on this journey to where we are now. We give God all the glory for anything we have been able to accomplish.

Come visit, we get visitors dropping by every day. I guarantee you will be blessed beyond words. If the time is right, we will fill your belly at the Bread of Life Café.
